2021: A Year of Transformative Growth

While 2021 brought unique challenges, it also presented exciting opportunities for Call2Recycle. This last year allowed our team to listen, learn and harness Call2Recycle's 27 years of institutional and industry knowledge. The year ended with incredible outcomes and a tremendous appreciation for those instrumental in Call2Recycle's success – our staff, board of directors, stewards, and collection partners.

Advancing a battery collection and recycling program during another year in a pandemic is no easy feat. Leading with a safety-first mindset, we worked alongside our stewards, service providers, and collection partners to create contingency plans, navigate price surges, balance customer demand, overcome collection site obstacles, and manage supply chain disruptions. As a result of the continued commitment from our incredible network, we collected and recycled more than 8.1 million pounds of batteries in the U.S. in 2021. Vermont added to that success by collecting more than 148,000 pounds of primary batteries for recycling, the largest weight in the state stewardship program's history and a 46% increase over 2020.

Advances in battery technology also offered growth opportunities for Call2Recycle. Given our experience in helping to minimize the complexities associated with safely collecting, transporting, and recycling batteries, we saw an increasing demand from a wide range of industries and organizations seeking guidance on the responsible management of their batteries. One of those successes is the launch of the first voluntary industry-wide electric bicycle (e-bike) battery recycling program with PeopleForBikes and their sustainability task force of more than 40 bike industry leaders from 20 PeopleForBikes member companies. Through e-bike manufacturers and brand-owners funding, the nationwide program will provide the crucial connection from rider to recycling. We are proud to play a pivotal role in ensuring that the batteries used to power this sustainable, climate-friendly transportation solution are safely and responsibly managed at their end of life.

The future looks promising with continued advancement afoot, with climate change propelling electrification and batteries remaining central to the discussion. As battery technology and usage soars, Call2Recycle will continue doing its work to revolutionize the collection, processing, recycling, and reuse of materials. We remain steadfast in our commitment to protecting people, property, and the environment and to evolving our world through intentional and inventive battery management.

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
